



Greg Ellis Vice President, Energy & Environmental Policy, Federal Affairs, and General Counsel

Greg joined the Indiana Chamber of Commerce in May 2016 as vice president of energy and environmental policy. He became the Chamber's federal lobbyist in May 2018. In addition to his lobbying duties at the Statehouse and in Washington, D.C., Greg was named the Chamber's

general counsel in June 2022.

Previously, Greg served as an administrative law judge for the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission for six years. Prior to that, he developed and managed the first state and federal government affairs program and administered the federal political action committee for a national trade association dealing with tax and commercial real estate issues.

Among Greg's other roles, he served as the business ombudsman for the Indiana Department of Environmental Management and legal counsel for the Indiana Department of Natural Resources. He was chief legal counsel and legislative liaison for the Indiana Civil Rights Commission. In addition, Greg served as an Indiana representative on the Council of Great Lakes Governors during development of the Great Lakes Compact. He has also been in the private practice of law and is a registered mediator.

Greg currently serves on the board of directors for the Government Affairs Society of Indiana and is active with the Utility Law Section of the Indiana State Bar Association and Indianapolis Bar Association. Greg is a member of the American Society of Association Executives and the National Institute of Lobbying and Ethics.

Greg received his Bachelor of Science degree from Indiana State University and his Doctor of Jurisprudence degree from the Indiana University Robert H. McKinney School of Law. He resides in Zionsville with his family.
